Dr. Bernardo Trigatti, B.Sc, Ph.D.

PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD



r. Bernardo Trigatti, more familiarly known as Dino Trigatti, is an Associate Professor in the Department of Biochemistry and Biomedical Sciences at McMaster University. He is also a member of the Thrombosis and Atherosclerosis Research Institute, affiliated with McMaster University and Hamilton Health Sciences.

Dr. Trigatti and his team use a combination of biochemical and genetic approaches in laboratory mice to tease out the genes that are responsible for development or hardening

of the arteries, particularly focusing on how HDL (the good cholesterol) can both protect against, and in fact reverse this disease. The information provided by this research will lead to new understanding and development of new therapeutic approaches for cardiovascular disease in people. Dr. Trigatti's research group is probing the mechanisms that underlie development of atherosclerosis, or "hardening of the arteries", the disease that causes narrowing of the arteries and is the leading cause of heart attacks and strokes.

Dino Trigatti was born and raised in Hamilton. He attended St. Jean de Brebeuf and St. Thomas Moore Secondary schools, and received both his undergraduate (B.Sc.) and graduate (Ph.D.) degrees from McMaster University in the field of Biochemistry. He completed postdoctoral training from 1995-2000 at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, MA, USA. He returned to Hamilton in 2000 to take up a faculty position at McMaster University in the Department of Biochemistry and Biomedical Sciences at the Assistant Professor level. He became an Associate Professor with tenure in 2007 and joined the Thrombosis and Atherosclerosis Research Institute in 2010.

Dr. Trigatti also teaches in both the undergraduate and graduate programs in Biochemistry and Biomedical Sciences as well as the graduate program in Medical Sciences at McMaster University. He has mentored a number of young scientists at the undergraduate, graduate, and postdoctoral levels. Dr. Trigatti reviews grant applications for National and International research funding agencies, currently as a member of grant study panels for the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, The Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, and the American Heart Association. Dr. Trigatti is also a member of the editorial board of the journal, Biochemistry Research International, and is a Section Editor of the journal, Biochimica et Biphysica Acta-Molecular and Cell Biology of Lipids.

Dr. Trigatti has received numerous awards and acknowledgements. Such accomplishments include, Fellowships from the Medical Research Council of Canada and the William T. McEachern Foundation, a New Investigator Award from the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, and a Young Investigator Award from Pfizer Canada as well as the Canadian Lipoprotein Conference. Lastly, he has received a McMaster University Alumni Association Arch Award.

Dr. Trigatti is married to Gabriella Cadeddu and has three children. Their names are Alessandro, Marco, and Luca.
